

Wooden Sheep Craft Project

Supplies needed per child:

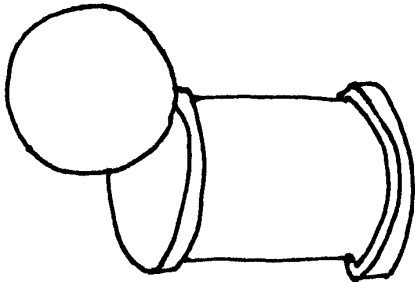
- 1 small wooden spool (approximately 1" by 1¼")
- 1 wooden ball (1" in diameter)
- 1 dark brown pipe cleaner, cut in half
- 1 piece 'sheep wool' fake fur (1¼" by 3¼")
- 1 small wooden bead for tail
- glue

Preparation before class:

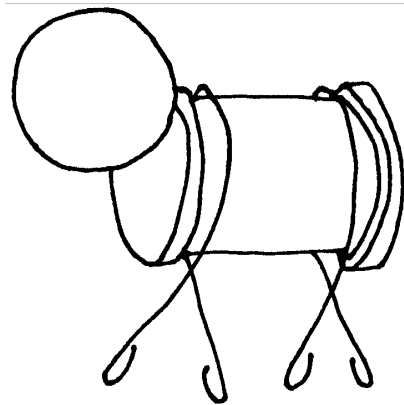
1. With wood glue, glue the wooden ball onto the end of the wooden spool. This forms the body of the sheep. Let dry
2. Cut out the little fur pieces. When cutting fur, skim the scissors just through the fabric backing, not cutting the fur. The pieces will pull apart.
3. Cut the pipe cleaners in half with craft type wire cutters

Instructions for class:

1. Wrap and glue the brown legs around the body of the sheep, front and back. Twist under the body and spread the legs so the sheep can stand. Turn back the ends of the four legs about a ¼ inch to make the feet.
2. Glue the sheep skin over the top, letting it hang down on the sides.
3. Glue the little bead on the back for the tail.



Glue the wooden ball to the spool, forming a head and body.



Wrap the two ½ pipe cleaners around the body, forming the legs
